



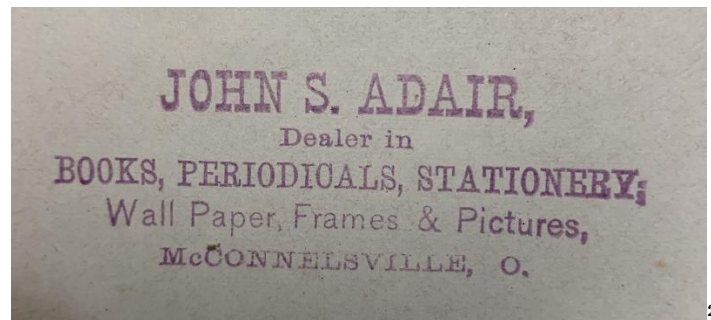
## John Sebastian Adair, 1 Lieutenant, Co. D, 97 OH Infantry, US

- 1839 October 27: Born to James and Isabella Stephenson Adair in Muskingum County, OH.
- 1844 January 19: Father, James, moved his young family to McConnelsville, OH and started a newspaper called *The Independent*, he was editor and publisher. It was later enlarged and called *The Herald*.<sup>1</sup>
- 1850 July 25: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Morgan County, OH showed ten-year-old John living with his parents and siblings. His father was a printer.
- 1860 June 4: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Morgan County, OH showed twenty-year-old John living with his parents and siblings. He was listed as a printer along with his father and two other brothers.
- 1862 August 4: Enlisted in the U.S. Army and mustered into Co. D, 97 OH Infantry.  
December 27: Promoted to Full 2 Lieutenant.
- 1864 October 12: Promoted to Full 1 Lieutenant.
- 1865 June 10: Mustered out at Nashville, TN.
- 1870 August 10: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Morgan County, OH showed John living with his parents and siblings. He was listed as a bookseller and stationier. John was listed as having a real estate and personal estate value of \$8,000.00.
- 1875 January 7: John married Mary Hann in Morgan County, OH

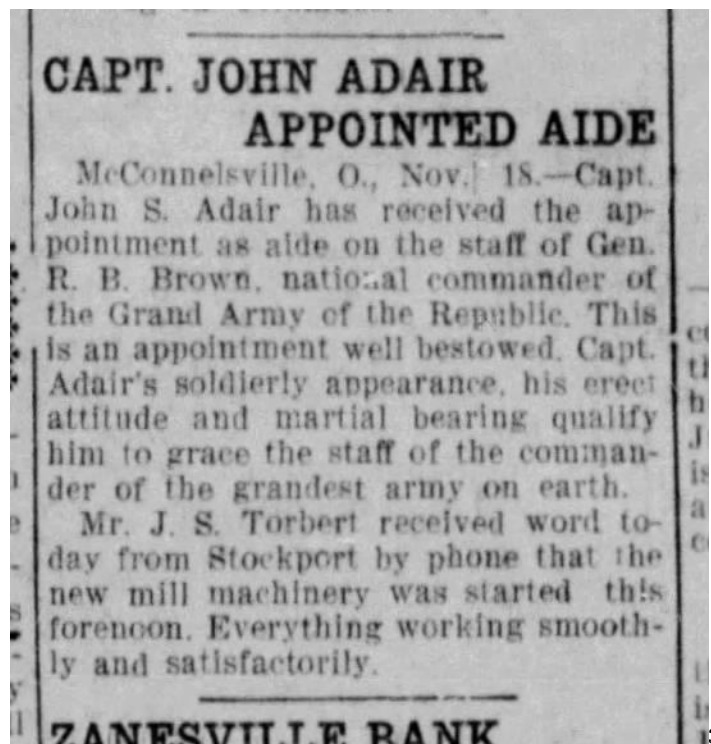

1880 June 11: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Morgan County, OH showed John, his wife, and child Henry were living with his parents. His occupation was listed as retail book store.



1900 June 13: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Morgan County, OH showed John living with his wife and child. His occupation was listed as Merchant Stationary Books.

- 1910 April 15: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Morgan County, OH showed 70-year-old John was living with his wife, Mary. His occupation was listed as News Dealer.
- 1913 December 26: John died in McConnellsville, Morgan County, OH. He was buried in McConnellsville Cemetery, in Morgan County, OH.
