


Adam Emmert, Jr. August 17, 1840 – January 23, 1893

## Adam Emmert, Private, Co. F, 80th Indiana, US

- 1840 Aug 17: Adam Emmert was born in Machtilshausen, Bad Kissingen, Bayern, Germany.
- $1846 \quad The \ Emmert \ family \ immigrated \ to \ America.$
- 1862 Aug 14: Adam Emmert enlisted in the US Army at Cynthiana, IN. He was mustered into Co. F, 80th IN Infantry as a private.

- Nov 30: Pvt. Adam Emmert fought at the Battle of Franklin. The 80th IN was part of Col. Orlando Moore's brigade in Gen. Thomas Ruger's Division. The 80th IN formed part of Moore's line that ran on the west side of the Columbia pike near where the Carter's Creek pike enters Franklin. During the combat, Pvt. Emmert was wounded.
- 1865 Jun 22: Discharged from the US Army in Salisbury, NC.
- 1866 Oct 23: Married Marianna Wolf in Evansville, IN.
- Aug 3: The US Federal Census enumerated in Gibson County, IN listed Adam Emmert at thirty years old. He was working for the railroad and his wife Anna was keeping house. They lived with their two children and Adam's elderly father.
- 1880 Jun 11: The US Federal Census enumerated in Gibson County, IN listed Adam Emmert at thirty nine years old. He was employed as a carpenter and was the head of the household. He lived with his wife Anna and five children.
- 1889 Dec 26: Adam Emmert attended a reunion for the 80th IN Infantry.



1893 Jan 23: Adam Emmert died. He was buried in the Saints Peter and Paul Cemetery in Haubstadt, Indiana.
