


Alfred Franklin Hinson, 2 Lieutenant, Co. I, 8 AR Infantry, CSA

- 1837 September 8: Born to Atlas and Mary Blakeney Hinson in Alabama.
- 1850 August 24: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Clarke County, MS showed Alfred lived with the Stoddart family. James Stoddart was listed as a merchant. Alfred's occupation was listed as farmer.
- 1858 June 20: Alfred married Mary Russell in Leavenworth County, KS.
- 1860 August 6: Court case in Douglas County, Kansas claiming Alfred and Asa Bushnell owned John Inlow for \$140.00.

August 12: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Bolivar County, MS showed Alfred lived with his wife and six month old son, Frank, in the home of his father. His occupation was listed as farmer.

1861 April 4: Forced to sell property to cover the debt he owed John Inlow.



December 8: Enlisted in the C.S. Army and mustered into Co. I, 8 AR Infantry as a 1st Sergeant in Pocahontas, Arkansas.

1862 June 30-August 31: Company Muster Roll-Present

August 31-October 31: Company Muster Roll-Present

October 31-December 31: Company Muster Roll-Absent Severely Wounded in hand at the Battle of Stones River in Murfreesboro, TN.

December 31-February 28: Company Muster Roll-Absent "Wounded Sent off from Murfreesboro Jan 1, 1863."

1863 February 28-April 30: Company Muster Roll- Present.

April 30-June 30: Company Muster Roll- Present.

June 16: Promoted to 2nd Lieutenant.

June 30-August 31: Company Muster Roll- Present.

August 31-December 31: Company Muster Roll- Present.

1864 January 1-February 29: Company Muster Roll-Present.

February 29-April 30: Company Muster Roll-Present.

June 30-August 31: Company Muster Roll-Present.

November 30: Alfred fought at the Battle of Franklin. Cheathams Corp, Cleburne's Division, Govan's Brigade. Upon the conclusion of the battle, Alfred picked up a journal belonging to a US soldier named Austin Stebbins. It stayed with him until the end of the war. He continued to make entries where Stebbin left off. It remained in his family until 2023, when the journal was donated to the Atlanta Historical Society.

December 16: Captured at the Battle of Nashville, TN. Imprisoned at Johnson's Island.

1865 June 16: Released upon taking the Oath of Allegiance

1870 July 24: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Arkansas County, AR showed Alfred lived with his four year old daughter, Addie. His occupation was listed as a farmer.

1872 June 17: Alfred married Margaret Key.

- 1880 June 9: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Arkansas County, AR showed Alfred lived with his wife, Margaret, and four children. His occupation was listed as a farmer and judge of the county court.
- 1889 January 25: Alfred was appointed special judge in Little Rock, Arkansas.
