

## Alfred D. Birdwell, Private, Co. G, 19 TN Infantry, C. S.

- 1843 December 12: Birdwell was born to Benjamin and Lydia Birdwell in Sullivan County, TN.
- 1850 November 16: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Sullivan County, TN showed seven-year-old Alfred living with his parents and siblings. His father, Benjamin, was a millwright.
- 1860 July 6: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Sullivan County, TN showed 17-year-old Alfred, a farm laborer, living with his parents and siblings. His father, Benjamin, was a millwright.
- 1861 August 1: Enlisted in the C.S. Army in Loudon, TN and mustered into Co. G, 19 TN Infantry as a private
- 1862 May 10: Reenlisted in Corinth, MS.
- 1863 January & February: Company Muster Roll. Present.  
March & April: Company Muster Roll. Absent. Remarks "Sent to Hosp Mar 25<sup>th</sup>/63"  
July to October: Company Muster Rolls. Present.
- 1864 January to April: Company Muster Rolls. Present.  
November 30: Wounded at the Battle of Franklin.  
December 17: Captured in Franklin.  
December 25: Admitted to Hospital #1 in Nashville.

- 1865 January 8: From Nashville forwarded to Louisville then on to Camp Chase, OH.

May 12: Birdwell signed his Oath of Allegiance and was released from Camp Chase.

- 1870 August 19: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Sullivan County, TN showed Alfred, a farmer, living with his parents.
- 1878 November 20: Married Amanda C. Gobble in Washington County, VA.
- 1880 June 16: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Washington County, VA showed Alfred, a mill hand, living with his new wife Amanda.

\*\*\*Alfred died sometime before 1888, as his wife remarried.\*\*\*
