
Charles Buxbaum, Private, Co. E, 75 PA Infantry, U.S.A.

1825	Buxbaum was born in Prussia (what is today Germany).
	(abt) Buxbaum moved to Albany, NY
1855	June 9: The New York Census enumerated in Albany County, showed Buxbaum worked as a bartender. He had already been a naturalized citizen by this point.
1861	September 6: Enrolled in the U.S. Army. Buxbaum signed up with the 75 PA Infantry. His point of origin was given as Philadelphia, PA. His age was given as 36 years old. He is noted to have been working as a "weaver."
1864	January 1: Buxbaum re-enlisted in the U.S. Army while in Chattanooga, TN.
	November 30: Buxbaum was captured at the Battle of Franklin. He was sent to Andersonville Prison, GA.
1865	April 28: Buxbaum was released from Andersonville Prison, GA via prisoner exchange.
	June 5: According to the History of Pennsylvania Volunteers, Buxbaum mustered out of the U.S. Army on this day.
	(abt) Buxbaum moved to New York City, NY.
1879	August 31: Buxbaum married Lena Green in Manhattan, New York, NY.

The exact date of Buxbaum's death is unknown. Records for him seem to cease after this point.

1929 September 24: When Lena Buxbaum died, she was buried next to her husband. They're together at Mount Carmel Cemetery, Glendale, Queens County, NY.
