September 1: Present.

December 28 - January 4: Appears on Injury List for the Battle of

Murfreesboro, remarks: "Slightly wounded on December 31st."

1863: Company Muster Roll: September - October: Present.

1864: November 30: Wounded at the Battle of Franklin.

December 26: Nashville TN, Hospital No. 1. "Amputation of right arm,

upper 3rd."

1865: January 20: Roll of Prisoner of War: Received at Camp Chase Ohio from

Louisville, KY. Where Captured: Franklin TN. When Captured: Dec. 18th,

1864. Remarks, "Received from Louisville KY, January 20 1865."

March 28: Roll of Prisoner of War: Transfer from Camp Chase Ohio to Point Lookout MD, March 28, 1865. Where Captured: Franklin, TN. When Captured: Dec. 18th, 1864. Remarks, "Transferred to Point Lookout March

26 1865."

May 27: James M Capps died at Point Lookout Confederate Prisoner of War Camp in MD, and is buried in the Confederate Cemetery within the camp.
