

## Owen Carpenter, Private, Co G., 22nd MS Infantry, CSA

1828: Owen Carpenter was born to John and Esther Carpenter in Mississippi.

1850: October 15: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in South Division of Carroll County, MS, and showed a twenty-one-year-old Owen was living with his parents John and Esther as well as his four siblings. Owen was listed as a laborer on his fathers farm.

1860: August 1: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Carroll County MS and showed a thirty-two-year-year-old Owen was living with his wife, M.S., and their three children. Owen owned one slave and was listed as a farmer.

1862: July 23: Owen Carpenter mustered in the 22nd MS Infantry, Co. G in Blackhawk MS as a private.

Company Muster Roll: September - December: Absent, "sick."

1863: Company Muster Roll: May - June: Absent, "absent without leave."

Company Muster Roll: July - December: Present

1864: Company Muster Roll: March - August: Present

Company Muster Roll: August 31 - February 28, 1865: Absent, "Killed at Battle of Franklin, November 30 1864."

November 30: Owen Carpenter was killed in action at the Battle of Franklin and was buried in the McGavock Confederate Cemetery, section forty-seven MS gave 386.
