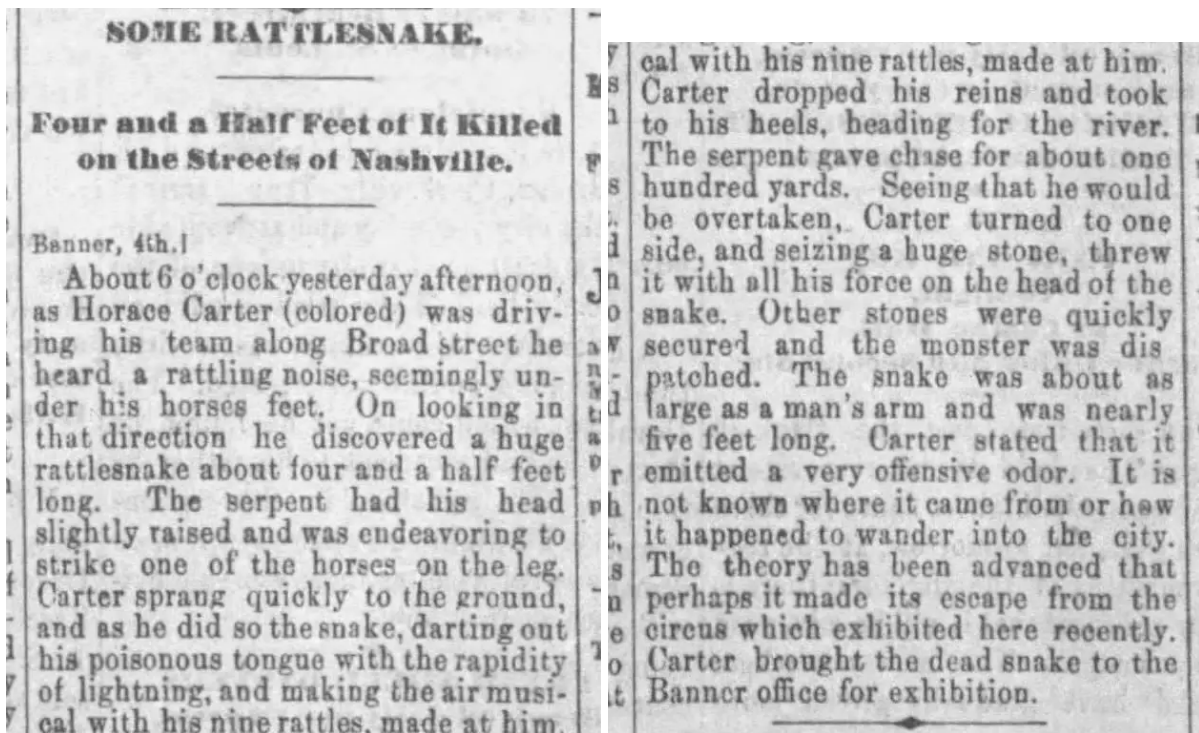


Horace Carter  
1861-1882  
Enslaved at Carter House

- 1860 Horace was born abt 1860. He was born a slave at the Carter farm to Jack and Calfurnia.
- 1861 February 18 & 19: Medical ledgers kept by Fountain B. Carter show that “Calph’s child Horace” was sick and was treated for perhaps a cough? He was given “expect.”
- 1870 June 21: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Franklin, Williamson County, TN showed 9-year-old Horace living with his parents, Jack and Calfurnia, and his siblings.

\*\*\*sometime between 1878-1881 Horace and his brother Frank made their way from Franklin, Tn to Nashville, TN.\*\*

- 1881 October 4: Horace killed a snake on Broad St. in Nashville.
