

Charles Stover, Private, Co. B, 12 TN Cavalry, USA

- 1845 October 26: Born to Michael and Harriet Tucker Stover in Sullivan County, Tennessee.
- 1850 October 15: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Sullivan County, TN showed Charles, 5, lived with his parents and siblings. George, 6, and twins, John and Sarah, 1. His father's occupation was listed as farmer.
- 1860 June 12: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Hawkins County, TN showed Charles, 15, lived with his parents and siblings. George, 16, Albert, 9, and Susan, 7. The twins had passed in that ten year period. His father's occupation was listed as a teamster.
- 1863 October 2: Enlisted as a Private, CO. B, 12 TN Cavalry in Jonesboro, TN.
- November-December: Company Muster Roll: Absent-On detached service at Nashville since Dec. 29, 1863
- 1864 February 29: Company Muster Roll: Absent-On detached service at Nashville since Dec. 29, 1863.
- March-April: Company Muster Roll: Present
- May-June: Company Muster Roll: Present
- July-August: Company Muster Roll: Present
- September-October: Company Muster Roll: Present
- November 30: Charles fought at the Battle of Franklin across the Harpeth River with Wilson's Cavalry.
- 1865 January-February: Company Muster Roll: Present
- March-April: Company Muster Roll: Present
- May-June: Company Muster Roll: Absent-Sick in Hospital, Ft. Leavenworth, Kansas since June 18, 1865.

July-August: Company Muster Roll: Discharged at Ft. Leavenworth, Kansas, July 1st 1865.

1870 June 3: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Greene County, TN showed Charles lived with William and Penelopy Stover, his aunt and uncle. His occupation was listed as a house carpenter.

The death and burial of Charles Stover is unknown at this time.
