

David Lindsley Beavers, Corporal, Co. A 29th TN, C.S.

- 1842 June 14: David Lindsley Beavers is born to Hiram and Martha Beavers in North Carolina.
- 1850 September 18: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in McMinn, Tennessee showed ten-year-old David Beavers living with his parents and four siblings. His father was listed as a farmer.
- 1860 June 9: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in McMinn, Tennessee showed seventeen-year-old David Beavers living with his parents and six siblings. His father was listed as a farmer.
- 1862 July 26: David Beavers enlisted in the C.S. Army in Knoxville, TN. He mustered into the 29th TN, Company A. His brother, Richard, enlisted with the same regiment on the same day.
- November – December: Company Muster Roll. Present.
- 1863 January – February: Company Muster Roll. Present.
- March – April: Company Muster Roll. Present.
- July – August: Company Muster Roll. Present.
- September – October: Company Muster Roll. Absent, remarks “Wounded at the battle of Chickamauga 20 October 1863”
- November – December: Company Muster Roll. Present, remarks “Elected 3rd Corporal from rank, February 15 1864. Name appears in column names present as David Beavers.
- 1864 January – February: Company Muster Roll. Present.
- 1870 June 16: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in McMinn, Tennessee showed twenty-six-year-old David Beavers living with his parents and seven siblings. David was listed as a school teacher.
- 1910 April 30 & May 1: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in McMinn, Tennessee showed sixty-seven-year-old David Beavers living with his sister Martha. David was listed as a farmer.

- 1920 January 16 & 17: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in McMinn, Tennessee showed seventy-seven-year-old David Beavers living with his sister Martha. David was listed as not having a job.
- 1924 November 5: David Beavers dies in Goodlettsville, TN at the age of eighty-two. He is buried at The Tennessee Confederate Soldiers Home Cemetery in Nashville, TN.
