1830 (abt) Dick was born. It is unknown who he was enslaved by at his birth or where he was born.

\*\*\*By the 1840's Dick was living in Tennessee and owned by Harold S. Mathews.

September 15: John McGavock and his cousin Lysander both went to a sale of slaves owned by Harold S. Mathews, their cousin Margaret's¹ husband. John purchased a 17-year-old boy named Dick. Lysander purchased Bob, age 21, Matthew, age 11 and Frederick age 9. The sale was in Maury County, TN.

- 1850 The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Williamson County showed John McGavock as the owner of twenty-eight slaves. Dick would have been among the twenty-eight.
- 1853 Six years later an advertisement appeared in the Weekly Review in Franklin. Dick had escaped. John McGavock put up a \$50 reward for his return.
