

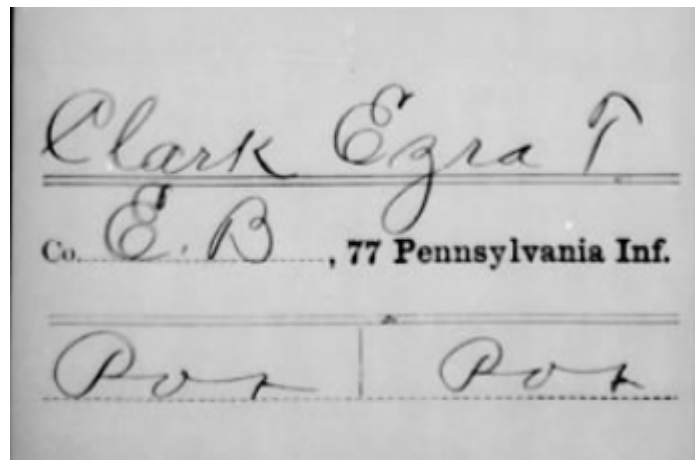
Ezra Theodore Clark, Private, Co. B, 77th PA Infantry, USA

1844 Apr 6: Ezra T. Clark was born to parents John and Louisa Clark in PA.

1860 Aug 17: The US Federal Census enumerated in Potter County, PA listed Ezra T Clark at sixteen years old. He lived in his brother's household but his father and mother were listed living there as well. The Clark family were employed as farmers.

1862 Feb 13: Enlisted in the US Army.

Apr 16: Mustered into Co. B, 77th PA Infantry as a private.



1864 Nov 30: The 77th PA Infantry fought at the Battle of Franklin. They were used as skirmishers for Gen. Grose's brigade in Gen. Kimball's division. As the Confederate army attacked, the 77th PA was driven back to the main line and Ezra Clark was wounded severely in the right thigh. Ezra Clark's right leg was amputated as a result.

1865 Apr 21: Discharged from the US Army on account of his injuries.

1868 Married Katherine "Kittie" Warren in WI.

1870 Aug 12: The US Federal Census enumerated in Dunn County, WI listed Ezra Clark at twenty four years old. He was employed as a farmer and lived with his eighteen year old wife Katharine and their first son Alfred who was 9 months old.

1880 June 4 & 5: The US Federal Census enumerated in Dunn County, WI listed Ezra T Clark at thirty six years old. He was employed working on cabinets. He lived with his wife Kittie and their son.

ROLL OF HONOR.

Following is the list of persons in Dunn county who are receiving pensions from the United States government, together with the cause for which pension is granted and the amount received by each per month. Since the compilation of this list changes have undoubtedly occurred in the post office address of a number of the pensioners while others may have been called to rest in the bivouac of the dead. The list embraces the names of 151 persons and the amount paid aggregates in round numbers \$15,000 per annum:

- 1900 Jun 27: The US Federal Census enumerated in Chippewa County, WI listed Ezra T. Clark at fifty six years old. Ezra lived with his wife, Kittie, and a boarder from Virginia named Thomas Coffman.
- 1905 Jun 1: The Wisconsin State Census conducted in 1905 for Chippewa County, WI listed Ezra T Clark at sixty one years old. Ezra lived with his wife, Kittie, and a boarder from Virginia named Thomas Coffman. Ezra was employed as a farmer.
- 1910 May 2-4: The US Federal Census enumerated in Chippewa County, WI listed Ezra T Clark at sixty seven years old. He lived with his wife, Kittie, and a hired man named J.W. Phillips. Ezra was working as a farmer.
- 1916 Feb 28: Ezra Theodore Clark died. He was buried in the Bloomer City Cemetery in Bloomer, WI.
