

Henderson Milton, Private, Co. G., 22 MS Infantry, CSA

Abt1843: Henderson Milton was born to a Cintha Milton, father unknown.

1850: October 4th: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Yalobusha, MS showed a seven-year-old Henderson was living with his mother, Cinthia, and his six siblings. Cinthia was not listed for an occupation but her two oldest sons were listed as farmers. The Milton family owned six slaves.

1860: August 27th: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Carroll MS showed a seventeen-year-old Henderson Milton was living with his mother, Cinthia, and stepfather, Isaac Stone. The family owned fourteen slaves. Henderson was not listed as having an occupation.

1861: August 12th: Milton enlisted in the 22nd Mississippi Volunteers, Black Hawk Rifles, as a private in Co. G for the length of the war.

Company Muster Roll: May - December: Present.

1862: Company Muster Roll: January - April: Absent, "sent to hospital in Oxford MS."

Company Muster Roll: May - August: Present.

Company Muster Roll: September - October: Absent: Remarks, "Absent, Sick."

Company Muster Roll: November - December: Present.

1863: Company Muster Roll: May - August: Absent: Remarks, "Absent, Sick."

Company Muster Roll: September - December: Present.

1864: Company Muster Roll: March - April: Absent: Remarks, "Sent to hospital in Alabama, February 20th 1864."

Company Muster Roll: July - August: Present.

Company Muster Roll: September - February 1865: Remarks, Killed at Battle of Franklin, November 30th, 1864.

November 30th: Henderson Milton was killed in the Battle of Franklin and was

buried in the McGavock Confederate Cemetery, Section twenty-seven,
Mississippi, grave seventy-nine.
