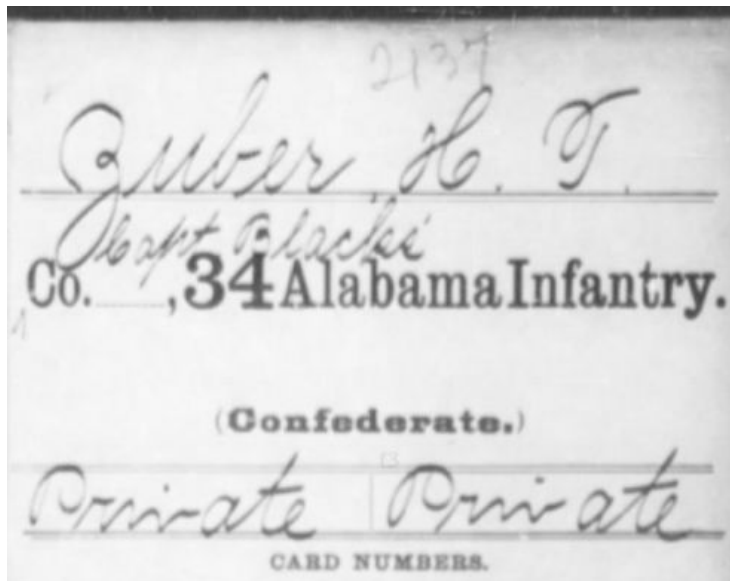


Henry T. Zuber, Private, Co. D, 45th AL Infantry, CSA

- 1845 Sep 18: Henry T. Zuber was born to parents Lovic and Elizabeth Zuber in GA.
- 1850 Nov 13: The US Federal Census enumerated in Harris County, GA listed Henry T. A. Zuber at five years old. His father Lovic was listed as a farmer. Henry also lived with his mother and three siblings.
- 1860 Jul 21: The US Federal Census enumerated in Macon County, AL listed Henry Zuber at fifteen years old. His father was a farmer and Henry lived with his parents and seven younger siblings.
- 1862 Mar 10: Henry Zuber enlisted in the 34th AL Infantry and was mustered in as a private.



Sep 25: Henry Zuber appeared on a register of payments for Confederate soldiers. He was paid \$44 for the period of time from May 1-Aug 31. By this time Henry had joined the 45th AL for reasons not known.

- 1863 Sep 16: Pvt. Henry Zuber appeared on a receipt roll for clothing issued to troops in the 45th AL Infantry.
- 1864 Nov 29: The 45th AL Infantry was engaged at the Battle of Spring Hill. They were part of Gen. Lowrey's brigade in Gen. Pat Cleburne's division. They attacked troops under Gen. Luther Bradley and delivered a serious blow to those men.
- Nov 30: The 45th AL Infantry was engaged at the Battle of Franklin. Still in Cleburne's division, the 45th AL assaulted the Federal works near the Carter cotton gin. They

sustained heavy casualties and Pvt. Henry Zuber was captured. He was moved north to Nashville with hundreds of other Confederate prisoners taken in the recent days.

Dec 2: Sent from Nashville, TN to Louisville, KY as a prisoner of war.

Dec 3: Received at Louisville, KY and sent to Camp Douglas, IL.

Dec 6: Received at Camp Douglas, IL

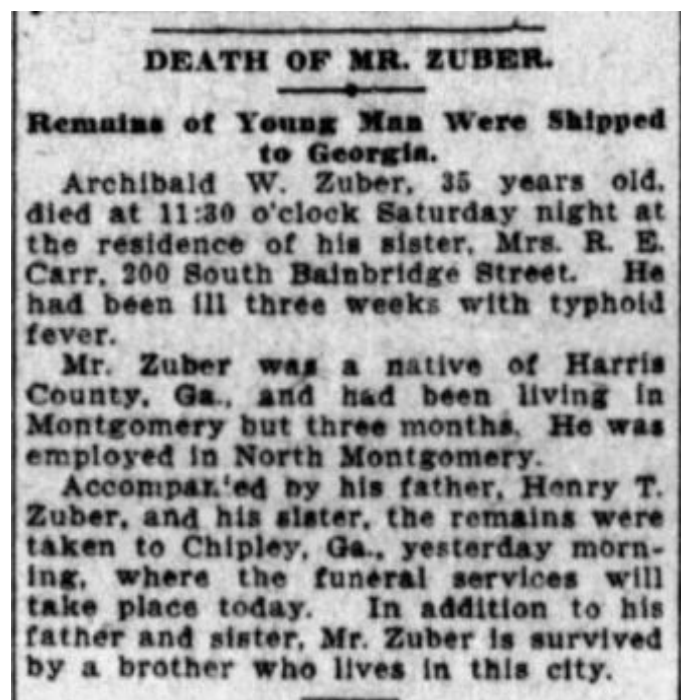
1865 June 18: Discharged and released from Federal custody at Camp Douglas after taking the oath of allegiance.

1869 According to the 1900 US Federal Census, Henry Zuber and Catherine Miller were married sometime in 1869.

1880 Jun 2: The US Federal Census enumerated in Harris County, GA listed H. T. Zuber at thirty four years old. He was the head of the household and was employed as a miller.

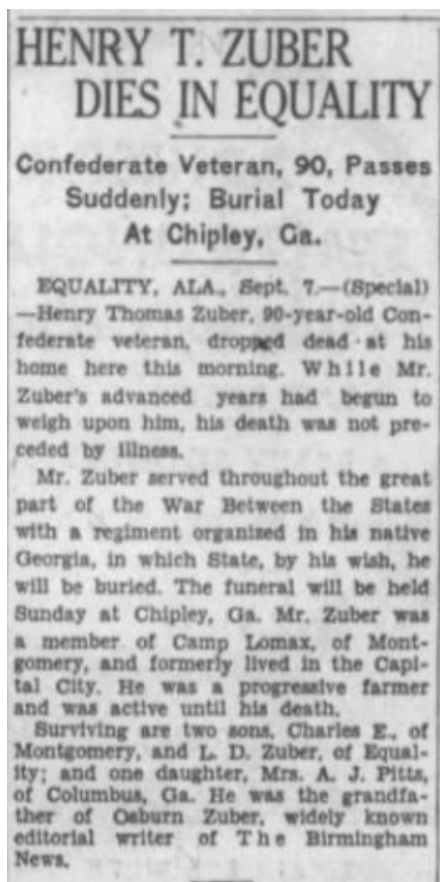
1900 Jun 1: The US Federal Census enumerated in Muscogee County, GA listed H. T. Zuber at fifty four years old employed as a carpenter. He was the head of his household and lived with his wife Catherine.

1905 Oct 23: Henry Zuber lost his son Archie to typhoid fever.

- 1910 Apr 20: The US Federal Census enumerated in Montgomery County, AL listed Henry Zuber as a sixty four year old carpenter. He was the head of his household and lived with his wife Catherine and their granddaughter Ruby.
- 1913 Nov 4: Henry's wife Catherine died in Montgomery, AL.
- 1920 Jan 17: The US Federal Census enumerated in Montgomery County, AL listed Henry Zuber as the head of his household at seventy four years old. He was self employed as a general mechanic. His granddaughter Ruby and her spouse Walter both lived with Henry.
- 1930 Apr 3: The US Federal Census enumerated in Coosa County, AL listed Henry Zuber at eighty four years old. He was widowed and listed as a veteran of the Civil War. He lived in the household of his son Lovic and his wife Neoma.
- 1935 Sep 6: Henry Thomas Zuber died at ninety years old in Equality, AL. He was buried in the Chipley cemetery in Pine Mountain, GA.

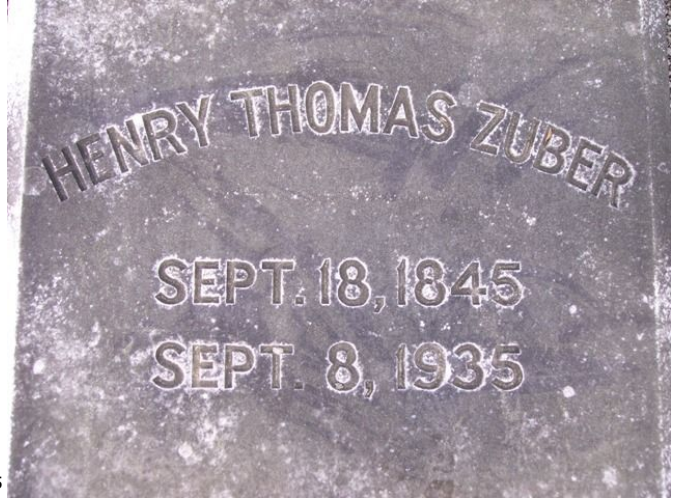
