
## James H Nicholson, 1st Lieutenant, Co. K, 1st FL Infantry, CSA

Abt. 1839	James H. Nicholson was born to Angus and Fanny Nicholson.
1840	The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Escambia, FL showed a one-year-old James H. Nicholson lived with his parents, Angus W. Nicholson and Fanny Nicholson.
1850	November 29: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Escambia, FL showed a twelve-year-old James lived with his parents and his six siblings. His father was listed as a clerk.
1860	June 26:The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Escambia, FL showed a twenty-one-year-old James H. Nicholson lived with his parents and his eight siblings. His father, Angus W. Nicholson owned four slaves, one male and three females. James was listed as a clerk.
1862	March 1: James H. Nicholson enlisted in the 1st FL Infantry, company K, in Pensacola Florida, for a three year enlistment.



September 30 - October 31: Company Muster Roll: Present. Remarks: Appointed 2nd Lt. May 7, 1862.

November - December: Company Muster Roll. Present.

- 1863 January December: Company Muster Roll: Present.
- 1864January February: Company Muster Roll: Present. Remarks: Promoted from<br/>2nd Lieutenant to 1st Lieutenant, January 2nd '64.

August 18: Inspectors Report near Atlanta, "sick at Greenville, GA," dated June 14th, 1864.

November 30th: Nicholson fought with the 1st FL Infantry under the command of Col. Robert Bullock in Finley's Brigade. Their attack was repulsed and 1st Lt. James Nicholson was killed in action. He was later moved to the McGavock Confederate Cemetery, section 103, Florida grave number 1.
