William Thomas Lee, Private, Co. F, 10th TX Infantry, C.S.

- 1843 December 6: Lee was born in Coosa County, AL to Isaiah and Demarius Lee.
- 1850 October 16: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Coosa County, AL showed five-year-old Thomas living with his parents and siblings. His father, Isaiah, was a farmer.
- 1860 June 14: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Coosa County, AL showed fifteen-year-old Thomas living with his parents and siblings. His father was a farmer and he and all of his brothers were listed as "farm hands."
 - September 9: Married Nancy Graves.
- 1861 October 13: Enlisted in the C.S. Army in Virginia Point, TX. He was eighteen years old.
- 1862 January & February: Company Muster Roll. Present. Remarks "sick in hospital." February to December: Company Muster Rolls. Present.
- 1863 January to December: Company Muster Rolls. Present.
- 1864 January to April: Company Muster Rolls. Present.

November 30: Killed in action at the Battle of Franklin. He was buried in Section 1, Grave 3 at the McGavock Confederate Cemetery.



January 3: Captain D.C. Walker wrote to Lee's wife Nancy and informed her that her husband had died in "the charge at Franklin, Tenn on November 30th."

Nancy later used the letter to apply for a Confederate Pension from the state of Alabama.
