

## Oglethorpe Love, Private, Co. H, 24th TX Cavalry, C.S.

- 1842(abt) Oglethorpe Love was born to Robert and Mary Wells Love in Texas.
- 1860 July 3: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Chappell Hill, Washington County, TX showed eighteen-year-old year old Ogle Love lived with his parents and six siblings. His father was a farmer.
- 1861 November 17: Oglethorpe enlisted in the C.S. Cavalry in Washington TX. He mustered into Co. H of the 24th TX Cavalry. Age 19.
- August 31: Company Muster Roll. Present.
- September - October: Company Muster Roll. Present.
- 1863 Roll of Prisoner of War. Where Captured: Ark Port, Arkansas. When Captured: January 11, 1863.
- May - June: Company Muster Roll. Present,
- July - August: Company Muster Roll. Absent, remarks "Absent sick in hospital. Due to the C.S. for Austrian Rifle \$25.00"
- September - October: Company Muster Roll. Present, remarks "Due to the Confederate states on Austrian Rifle.
- November - December: Company Muster Roll. Present.
- 1864 January to April: Company Muster Rolls. Present.
- November 30: Killed in action at the Battle of Franklin. Buried in McGavock Confederate Cemetery, section six, Texas grave seventy-seven.
