- 1835 Mordecai Haywood Garner was born in Pike County, AL to Israel and Sarah Garner.
- Nov 7: The US Federal Census enumerated in Dale County, AL listed Haywood Garner at fifteen years old. He was listed as a farmer and lived in the household of his father, Israel, who was listed as a farmer with \$50 in real estate.
- Jun 1:The US General Land Office records for Clarke County, AL recorded Mordecai Garner as the owner of one hundred fifty nine acres of land.

Jun 1: The US Federal Census enumerated in Clarke County, AL listed M H Garner as a twenty four year old farmer. He lived with his wife, Ellen, and a two month old son named Volney. The US Agricultural Census enumerated on the same day listed M H Garner as the owner of one hundred sixty acres, of which ten were improved. On those ten acres, he produced forty bushels of feed corn, one bale of cotton at 400 lbs, and his farm was worth \$325. He owned one horse and thirty two pigs. M H Garner was a small scale farmer for that area and time period.

 - Dec 17: Captured by Federal troops after being wounded and left to be treated after the Battle of Franklin.
- 1865 Jan 2: Received at Louisville, KY from Nashville, TN as a prisoner of war.
 - Mar 31: Received at Point Lookout, MD from Camp Chase, OH.
 - Apr 21: Mordecai Haywood Garner died at Point Lookout, MD. Cause of death: Pneumonia/ Infection of Lungs. He was buried in grave #1527 in the prisoner of war cemetery at Point Lookout.
