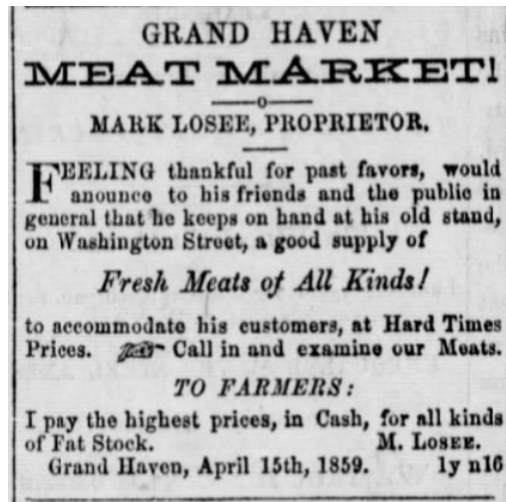
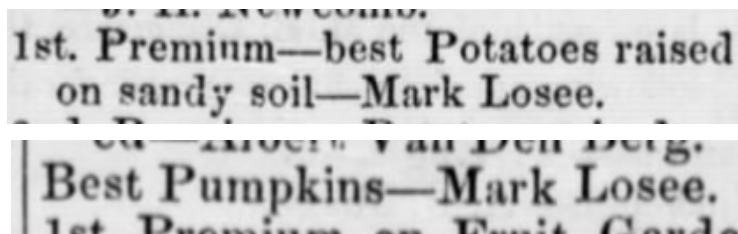


Mark Losee, Private, Co. D, 2 MI Cavalry, US

- 1814 Born in New York.
- 1840 The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Erie County, NY showed Mark lived with his wife, Roxy, and three children. He was listed as being employed in the manufacture and trade industry.
- 1851 The Census of Canada East, Canada West, New Brunswick, and Nova Scotia enumerated in Haldimand County showed Mark lived with his wife and seven children. His occupation was listed as a saw mill owner. His religion was listed as Baptist.
- 1860 July 31: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Ottawa County, MI showed Mark lived with his wife and four children. His occupation was listed as a butcher. John Fonte, 43, lived with the family. He was listed as a tallyman.



- 1862 October 15: Mark attended the Second Annual Exhibition of the Grand Haven Horticultural Association. He was awarded two awards for his produce.

1863 October 24: Enlisted into Co. D, 2nd Michigan Cavalry, as a private in Grand Rapids, Michigan.

1864 November 30: Fought and was wounded at the Battle of Franklin.

December 8: Died in Nashville, Tennessee from wounds sustained at the Battle of Franklin.
