

Richard Beavers, Private, Co. A, 29th TN, C.S.

- 1841(abt) Richard Beavers was born to Hiram and Martha Beavers in North Carolina.
- 1850 September 18: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in McMinn, Tennessee showed twelve-year-old Richard Beavers living with his parents and four siblings. His father was listed as a farmer.
- 1860 June 9: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in McMinn, Tennessee showed nineteen-year-old Richard Beavers living with his parents and six siblings. His father was listed as a farmer.
- 1862 July 26: Richard Beavers enlisted in the C.S. Army in Knoxville, TN. He mustered into the 29th TN, Company A. His brother, David, enlisted with the same regiment on the same day.
- November – December: Company Muster Roll. Not Stated, remarks, “Killed in the battle of Murfreesboro.”
- 1863 January 1: Roll of Prisoner of War: “Rich(?) Beavers, Co. A, 29 Regt Tenn.” Roll Dated: “Not Dated.” Where captured: “Near Murfreesboro.” When Captured: “Jan 1, 1863”
- January – February: Company Muster Roll. Absent, remarks “Killed in the battle of Murfreesboro December 31, 1862”
- March – April: Company Muster Roll. Present, remarks “Captured at Murfreesboro and exchanged since last muster.”
- May – June: Register. Period of Service: “May 1 – June 30, 1863.” When paid: “July 7.” By whom: “B.T. Bowman.” Amount: “\$22”
- July – August: Company Muster Roll. Present, remarks “Returned to duty from Hospital 22nd July 1863.”
- November – December: Company Muster Roll. Present, remarks, “name appears in column, names present as Richard Beavers.”
- 1864 January 16: Company Muster Roll, Camp Near Dalton: Not stated.
- January – February: Company Muster Roll. Present.

November 30: Killed in Action at The Battle of Franklin. Buried in McGavock Confederate Cemetery, section 55 Tennessee grave 57.
