
Squire Talbott, Private, Co. H, 27th IL Infantry, USA

- 1843 Feb: Squire Talbott was born to parents William and Elizabeth Talbott in Jackson County, IL.
- Jul 16: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Jackson County, IL listed the Talbott family with Squire's father, William, as the head of the household. Squire was listed as seventeen years old and his father was listed as a farmer.
- Aug 29: Squire Talbott enlisted in the 27th IL Infantry as a Private at Camp Butler, IL. He would have been eighteen years old.



Jan 1: Squire Talbott reenlisted in Co. H, 27th IL for three years at Blaine's Crossroads, TN. Description at muster, "Height: 5'8", Hair: Brown, Eyes: Gray, Complexion: Light."

Nov 30: Fought at the Battle of Franklin. His company was attached to the 79th IL Infantry and served under the command of Col. Joseph Conrad on an exposed defensive line in front of the main line. Conrad was relatively new to Brigade command and when the Confederate attack rushed forward, he and his men were wholly overwhelmed, captured, and overran. Somehow men like Pvt. Squire Talbott survived this and retreated north towards the safety of defensive works only to have to dodge return fire from their own men. Squire made it through this fight and slipped north to Nashville and safety with his comrades. The war was beginning to look over.

1865 Apr: Transferred to 9th IL as units were being consolidated at the close of the war.

Jun: Mustered out of 9th IL Consolidated Infantry

- 1878 Squire Talbott married Susan Austin in Jackson County, IL.
- 1880 March 10: Filed pension as an invalid.

Jun 1: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Jackson County, IL showed Squire Talbott lived with his wife, a step daughter, and a newborn daughter. Squire is listed as a farmer.

- 1886 Dec 4: Squire's wife, Susan, died after only eight years of marriage.
- 1900 Jun 23: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Jackson County, IL stated that Squire Talbott was fifty seven years old and resided as a boarder in a home owned by Margaret Cochran.
- 1909 Apr 23: Squire Talbott died in Ava, IL. He was buried in Crain Cemetery.



women. Esquire Talbott, for some years a member of the Soldiers' home here, died yesterday at the age of 65. He served during the Civil war as a member of company H, twenty-seventh Illinois infantry.
