

Stephen Braddock, Private, Co. B, 32nd MS Infantry, C.S.

1841 (abt.) Braddock was born in South Carolina to Adam and Elizira Braddock.

1850 September 13: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Tippah County, MS showed nine-year-old Stephen Braddock is living with his parents and two siblings. His father was a farmer.

1860 June 25: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Tippah County, MS showed twenty-year-old Stephen Braddock, working with his father, Adam, as a farmer, and living with his parents and six siblings. His father owned three slaves.

1862 March 17: Braddock enlisted in the C.S. Army in Tippah, MS. He mustered into the 32nd MS Infantry. Age 21.

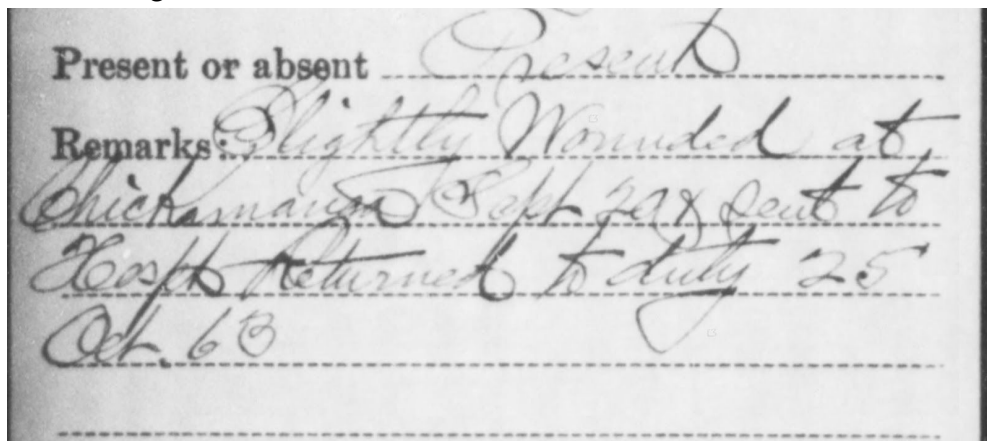
May – August: Company Muster Rolls. Present.

November – December: Company Muster Roll. Absent. Remarks “Absent in Mississippi, paroled in Kentucky”

1863 January – February: Company Muster Roll. Absent. Remarks “Absent without leave in Mississippi.” Braddock’s younger brother, George, enlisted and mustered into the 32nd MS February 14 1863.

March – July: Company Muster Rolls. Present.

September – October: Company Muster Roll. Present. Remarks “Slightly wounded at Chickamauga September 20 & sent to hospital. Returned to duty 25, October ‘63”

November – December: Company Muster Roll. Present.

1864: January – February: Company Muster Roll. Present.

March – April: Company Muster Roll. Present. Remarks “Reenlisted for the war, February 6, 1864.”

November 30: Killed in action at the Battle of Franklin. Buried in McGavock Confederate Cemetery Section 30, Mississippi Grave 131.
