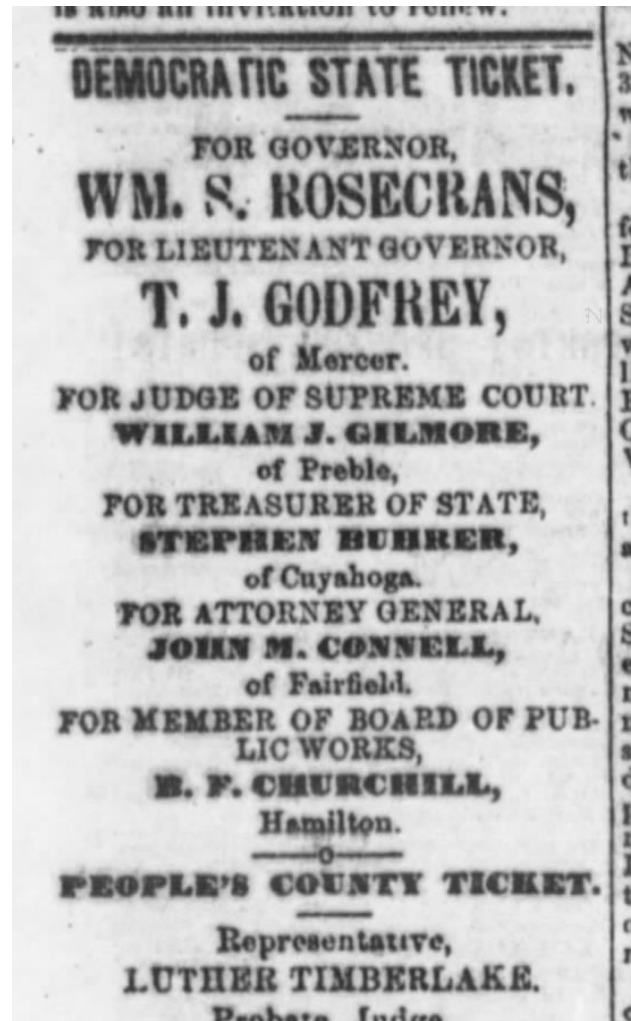




Luther Timberlake, Lieutenant, Co. D, 26 OH Infantry, US

- 1836 July 12: Timberlake was born to Warren and Susan Timberlake in Morgan County, OH.
- 1850 September 13: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Meigsville, Morgan County, OH showed 14-year-old Luther living with his parents and siblings. His father, Warren, was a potter.
- 1860 July 30: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Meigsville, Morgan county, OH showed Luther, a farmer, living with his parents and younger siblings.
- 1861 June 8: Enlisted in the U.S. Army and mustered into Co. D., 26 OH Infantry.
- 1862 March 21: Promoted to full Sergeant.
- 1863 April 25: Promoted to Lieutenant.
- 1864 February 26: Married Sarah Ann Moore in Morgan County, OH.
November 30: Fought at the Battle of Franklin.
- 1865 January 23: Mustered out of the U.S. Army.

1869 August 6: Running for office.



1880 June 23: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in New Birmingham, Guernsey County, Oh showed Luther, a minister of the Gospel, and Sarah living with their school aged children.

1890 Enumerated on the 1890 U.S. Veterans Schedule. He lived in Flushing, OH and suffered from Catarrh of the head.²

1894 September 27: Appointed Methodist Episcopal minister to Cambridge District.³

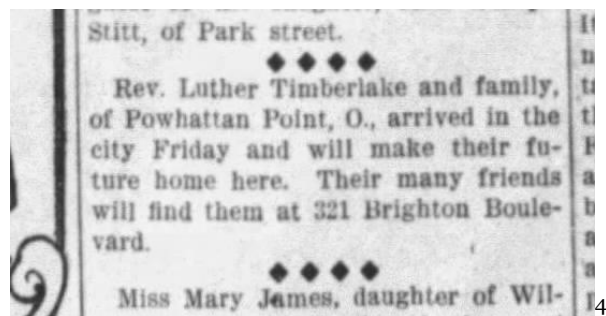

² "Catarrh is inflammation of the mucous membranes in one of the airways or cavities of the body, usually with reference to the throat and paranasal sinuses. It can result in a thick exudate of mucus and white blood cells caused by the swelling of the mucous membranes in the head in response to an infection."

1900 June 5: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Clay, Tuscarawas County, OH showed Luther, a minister, and Sarah living with two of their daughters and a grandson.

1905 October 7: Moved to Zanesville, OH.



1910 April 23: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Zanesville, Muskingum County, OH showed Luther, a Methodist minister, and Sarah living with two widowed daughters.

1915 May 1:

Morning preach by Rev. W. H. Miller, field secretary of the Ohio Conference Claimant Commission, subject, "The Church's Obligation." Evening preaching by the Rev. Luther Timberlake. He will preach on "One Word of Two Syllables."

1920 January 5: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Zanesville, Muskingum County, OH showed a widowed Luther living with his daughter, Emma.

1922 February 17: Died in Washington County, OH. He was buried at Matamoras Cemetery.
