Daniel Welsh, Private, Co. D, 90th OH Infantry, US

- 1846 Born to Henry and Rhoda welsh in Ohio.
- August 15: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Hocking, Fairfield County, OH showed seven year old Daniel living with his parents and siblings. His father, Henry, was listed as a "laborer."
- August 4: The U.S. Federal Census enumerated in Hocking, Fairfield County, OH showed sixteen year old Daniel living with his parents and siblings. Both Daniel and his father were listed as "farm hands," indicating that they were not farming their own land. His father had only \$40.00 in personal estate and no real estate.
- August 18: Enlisted in the U.S. Army and mustered into Co. D, 90th OH Infantry as a private. Younger brother Silas also enlisted and mustered into Co. D, 90th OH.



October 13: A fellow soldier by the name of Sgt. Williams of the same Company wrote a letter home to the local newspaper to inform the community of the 90th OH's activities this far he said:

"We are now up on the war path eager and anxious for the fray. We have been following the track of the invader of Kentucky for two weeks, and exciting has been the chase. Every muscle has had full play. Every energy has been put in requisition for the race, and now, nearly worn out, exhausted and foot sore, yet with ardor and indomitable spirit which characterizes an American soldier unabated, we have got the enemy at bay..."

1862-1864 Battles the 90th OH fought in.

1864 November 30: Welsh was mortally wounded at the Battle of Franklin in Kirby's brigade, Kimball's division.

December 30: Welsh died at a hospital in Louisville, KY from the wounds he received at Franklin. He was buried in Cave Hill National Cemetery.

Shaw had been a prisoner and lately exchanged.
