## William Lowndes Lockwood, Private, Co. B, 19 AL Infantry, CSA

- 1828 Feb 29: William Lockwood was born to parents Thomas and Mary Lockwood in South Carolina.
- 1850 Nov 16: The US Federal Census enumerated in Blount County, AL showed William living with the Bevens family. He was a twenty three year old man employed as a tinner.
  - The 1850 Slave Schedule enumerated in St. Michael and St. Phillip, SC showed that William's father Thomas Perkins Lockwood owned nine people aged sixty to one year old.
- 1854 Dec 23: William married Ellanora McDonough in Blount County, AL.
- Jun 7: The US Federal Census enumerated in Shelby County, AL listed thirty two year old William Lockwood as the head of the household. He was employed as a mechanic and lived with his wife Ellanora and three children.
- 1861 Aug 2: Enlisted as a musician in 19 AL Infantry at Summit, AL for three years.
- 1862 November: William L Lockwood appointed Regimental Tailor for the 19 AL Infantry.
  - Dec 31: Lockwood participated in the Battle of Stones River in Zachariah Deas's Brigade and was wounded.
- 1863 March 3: Discharged from a hospital in Rome, GA and given thirty days furlough.
- 1864 Nov 30: Lockwood fought with 19 AL in the Battle of Franklin. He was killed in action.
  - Lockwood was later exhumed from his battlefield grave and moved to the Confederate Cemetery at Carnton. He was buried in grave 15 in the Alabama section.
